There are 5 crowns offered to the church of the living God;

- (1) Crown of Life James 1:12, Rev. 2:10
- (2) Crown of Glory I Peter 5:24
- (3) Crown of Rejoicing I Thes 2:19-20, Phil 4:1
- (4) Crown of Righteousness II Tim 4:8
- (5) Incorruptible Crown I Cor 9:25-27

There is a crown of Glory in the present life to unfold, before our very eyes. So precious, so beautiful, so lovely and so mystified. The realization in this divine mystery is the Crown of Glory.
