

## What The Bible Says About Forgiveness - Handout

<u>Matthew 6:14-15 (NLT)</u> If you forgive those who sin against you, your heavenly Father will forgive you. But if you refuse to forgive others, your Father will not forgive your sins.

FORGIVENESS AND REPENTANCE
"You cannot honestly forgive someone unless that person shows some remorse for what they did."
There are at least three arguments people use for demanding repentance before granting forgiveness:
1. Forgiveness needs to be
<b>Ephesians 2:8-9</b> 8 For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God: 9 Not works, lest any man should boast.
2. Forgiving an unrepentant person invites further
<b>Romans 5:20b, 6:1-2</b> But where sin abounded, grace did much more abound <sup>1</sup> What shall we say then? Shall we continue in sin, that grace may abound? <sup>2</sup> God forbid. How shall we, that are dead to sin, live any longer therein?
3. Forgiving an unrepentant person is
The issue of repentance is vitally important to forgiveness, but totally irrelevant to forgiveness.
Romans 5:8 But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.
FORGIVENESS AND CONSEQUENCES
"If you really forgive someone, you would want that person to be released from the consequences of their actions."
The Bible clearly distinguishes between two very important words:
· is my desire to see another person suffer for the pain he has caused me. The Bible consistently warns against harboring this kind of feeling in my heart.
