

What It Means To Be Weak

People like winners

- · Every day on earth there are contests to see who is best at something.
- · Olympics, contests, leagues everybody cheers for the winners.
- People respect strong people healthy, disciplined, practiced, pretty.

I want to talk about being strong and being weak

- · What does it mean to be strong?
- · What does it mean to be weak?
- · Which is better?

1 John 3:1-8

- 1 Behold, what manner of love the Father hath bestowed upon us, that we should be called the sons of God: therefore the world knoweth us not, because it knew him not.
- 2 Beloved, now are we the sons of God, and it doth not yet appear what we shall be: but we know that, when he shall appear, **we shall be like him**; for we shall see him as he is.
- 3 And every man that hath this hope in him purifieth himself, even as he is pure.
- 4 Whosoever committeth sin transgresseth also the law: for sin is the transgression of the law.
- 5 And ye know that he was manifested to take away our sins; and in him is no sin.
- 6 Whosoever abideth in him sinneth not: whosoever sinneth hath not seen him, neither known him.
- 7 Little children, let no man deceive you: he that doeth righteousness is righteous, even as he is righteous.
- 8 He that committeth sin is of the devil; for the devil sinneth from the beginning. For this purpose the Son of God was manifested, that he might destroy the works of the devil.

We have an amazing promise from God!

- We shall live in eternity with an exciting, loving God.
- · We shall have bodies like His we can eat, walk through walls, and fly!
- But this HOPE causes men to PURIFY themselves to be sure of it!

1 Corinthians 9:24-27

- 24 Know ye not that they which run in a race run all, but one receiveth the prize? So run, that ye may obtain.
- 25 And every man that striveth for the mastery is temperate in all things. Now they *do it* to obtain a corruptible crown; but we an incorruptible.
- 26 I therefore so run, not as uncertainly; so fight I, not as one that beateth the air:
- 27 <u>But I keep under my body, and bring it into subjection</u>: lest that by any means, when I have preached to others, I myself should be a castaway.

Paul saw the importance of purifying himself to ensure his inheritance!

2 Corinthians 12:9-10

9 And he said unto me, My grace is sufficient for thee: for my strength is made perfect in weakness. Most gladly therefore will I rather glory in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me.

10 Therefore I take pleasure in **infirmities**, in **reproaches**, in **necessities**, in **persecutions**, in **distresses** for Christ's sake: <u>for when I am weak, then am I strong</u>.

Sometimes we are naturally weak:

- With temptations and fears from past bad experiences in our lives.
- With situations in which unbelievers and mockers surround us.
- · With financial and/or relationship hardnesses.

In contrast it is easy to see those who are strong naturally:

- · Have confidence in God and have overcome fears and anxieties.
- · Are surrounded by healthy, positive Christian(-like) environments.
- · Are blessed in both financial and social arenas.

All men are not created equal, but all are equally precious to God

- We are human products of genetic and environmental mixtures.
- · We need to be thoughtful for those less fortunate.

Romans 15:1-3

- 1 We then that are strong ought to bear the infirmities of the weak, and not to please ourselves.
- 2 Let every one of us please *his* neighbour for *his* good to edification.
- 3 For even Christ pleased not himself; but, as it is written, The reproaches of them that reproached thee fell on me.

Then there are those who are weak spiritually

- People have different levels of convictions in every church.
- Sometimes people have different levels of understanding between what constitutes sin and what constitutes a bad idea (choice).
- When we differ, there is a Scriptural way to deal with this situation...

Romans 14:1-7

1 Him that is weak in the faith receive ye, but not to doubtful disputations.

- 2 For one believeth that he may eat all things: another, who is weak, eateth herbs.
- 3 <u>Let not him that eateth despise him that eateth not</u>; and <u>let not him which eateth not judge him that eateth</u>: for God hath received him.
- 4 Who art thou that judgest another man's servant? to his own master he standeth or falleth. Yea, he shall be holden up: for God is able to make him stand.
- 5 One man esteemeth one day above another: another esteemeth every day *alike*. <u>Let every man be fully persuaded in his own mind</u>.
- 6 He that regardeth the day, regardeth *it* unto the Lord; and he that regardeth not the day, to the Lord he doth not regard *it*. He that eateth, eateth to the Lord, for he giveth God thanks; and he that eateth not, to the Lord he eateth not, and giveth God thanks.

How do we treat this person who disagrees with us?

- Should we exclude him/her from our fellowship lest we be poisoned?
- Should we accept him/her with the intention of converting them?
- Should we squabble, discuss and argue as often as we are together?

No! We are to accept them as children of God!

- We can learn from them and they can learn from us, willingly.
- We can enjoy good Christian fellowship in those areas in which we agree.
- We must admonish against sin, but not judge in areas of convictions.

<u>Funny Side Note – Who is really strong and who is really weak?</u>

- Those who have more liberty to do more things consider themselves strong they can handle more temptation without committing sin.
- Those who have more convictions and have more personal restraints will consider themselves strong more discipline and security = strength.
- But no matter which of these people read this passage of Paul, they both read it as though they are the strong ones and the others are weak.
- Thus, this passage applies to everyone!

What is a conviction – is it not a protection from feeling convicted?

- · Convictions are *personal* you know your strengths and weaknesses. Each person has a relationship with God that should not be breached.
- Convictions are *sacrificial* wisdom teaches the benefits of saying "No." Not all people can see all the dangers, or they may not fear the risks.
- · Convictions are *courteous* others may not be able to handle what you can. Concern for them may compel you to make additional sacrifices.
- 1 Corinthians 6:12 All things are lawful unto me, but all things are not expedient: all things are lawful for me, but I will not be brought under the power of any.
- 1 Corinthians 10:23 All things are lawful for me, but all things are not expedient: all things are lawful for me, but all things edify not.

We can choose to be Weak – or are we choosing to be Strong?

- There are many things that do not make up sin, but they may not be wise.
- Sacrifices made to the glory of God honour God and He will honour us.
- The more we say "No" naturally, the more God says "Yes" spiritually.

Have you said "No" to sin yet, and "Yes" to God?

- People think Christians are wimpy, but are you willing to confess God?
- Are you willing to make sacrifices (that others can't understand) for God?
- · Will you purify yourself that you might enjoy the Christian hope?
