Matthew 8:8 New Living Translation (NLT)

8 But the officer said, "Lord, I am not worthy to have you come into my home. Just say the word from where you are, and my servant will be healed.

As I sat in my office at home this week putting this message together for you, I looked out the window in front of me and sure enough, there he was.

- Doing what he does every single day.
- Rain or shine.
- Snow or heat.
- Calm weather, stormy weather.

He runs along for about 30 feet, jumps onto the side of a tree, looks all around for hawks and food and the sunshine and then does another little 30 ft run and does his hawk, food and sunshine search again, all across the property until he reaches my neighbors place where I lose him.

But no worries, come afternoon, here he comes back doing the same thing.

There has been a squirrel doing this for the 10 years that I have lived in our home.

- I have been watching this squirrel make his long journey from the woods to the left of our house to the woods to the right of our home every day for years.
- It's a long way especially for a squirrel.
- But I noticed that as I watched this little guy or girl, I felt some normalcy in the middle of all this Chaos.

See, I've been living in my home for 10 years now and every morning I watch this squirrel or its predecessors, do this journey across the middle of our property.

- In the morning he goes from the left to the right and in the afternoon, he goes from the right back to his home.
- There's a path he has actually worn in the yard.

• He knows it's there and no matter what kind of day I am having or what is going on in the world, I can count on a moment or normalcy as I watch this little squirrel do his long track along the wood line behind my house.

I was thinking this week as I watched him, how privileged he is.

- Apparently, he didn't get the news that a worldwide pandemic is happening right now.
- He's not scared of news casts.
- He's not worried about economic shutdowns

He's just doing what he does every day.

- He trots from the woods, along the creek line to Chris and Diane's place where I imagine he has a tree he eats from.
- Or maybe he just enjoys a nice long walk.
- All because he hasn't heard to words that you and I have been hearing lately.

- Words can hurt people deeply.
- And words can heal people.
- I've been at the bedside of terminal patients and seen where positive words brought them from the brink of death.

Proverbs 15:23 KJV

A man hath joy by the answer of his mouth: and a word spoken in due season, how good is it!

A man hath joy by the answer of his mouth...

• A person might not have money.

- They might not have popularity.
- They can be facing the worst disaster the world has ever faced, but what comes out of their mouth can bring them joy.
- The quality of your life depends on what comes out of your mouth.

Winston Churchill the Prime minister of England kept his nation and its allies in hope during the darkest hours of the 2nd World War.

- From September 1940 till May 1941The Nazi Blitz (Nighttime bombing of London and other British cities)

He was an old man.

With these famous <u>words</u>, he let every person in England know that he loved them, cared for them, and would toil, bleed and die alongside of them if it came down to it.

Did he have to do that?

- No
- Because his words brought an almost defeated Europe hope.
- His words brought defiance to its invader.
- His words said, "Enemy, you will not destroy us."
- "You may invade us.
- You may drop bombs on us.
- You may kill some
- But you will not defeat us."

To all of those working day and night in the hospitals and front lines of the war we are fighting against this Coronavirus I repeat Mr. Churchills words...

"Never in the field of human conflict was so much owed by so many to so few."
